HELPING PEOPLE ATTAIN ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SELF-SUFFICIENCY

Q. What is the Alliant Credit Union Foundation and what is its mission?

- A.** It is a not-for-profit charitable foundation established to promote economic empowerment and self-sufficiency in people, especially in communities where Alliant Credit Union members and employees live and work.



Q. How will the foundation accomplish its mission?

- A. Education** – Offering and supporting programs which raise the level of financial literacy of both youths and adults, while enlightening all people about the credit union difference.

Service – Donating time, energy and resources that improve the conditions of those in need of assistance.

Grants – Improving the lives of people through financial support.

Investment – Providing community development investment dollars for projects and programs aligned with our mission.



Q. Who owns the foundation?

- A.** The foundation is a separate, independent legal entity, incorporated in Illinois and registered as a 501c3 not-for-profit corporation with the IRS. It is operated by a Board of Directors comprised of Alliant Credit Union employees.

Q. How is it funded?

- A.** Initial funding for the foundation was established by a \$4 million grant from Alliant Credit Union. Income earned on these funds will be used to carry out the foundation's philanthropic activities.

Q. Does funding the foundation reduce member dividends or share value?

- A.** No. The source of initial funding came from surplus capital that Alliant has built up over many years. Foundation expenditures will be made independently from the operations of Alliant Credit Union.
